# The Winter Solstice the shortest day. ( June 22<sup>nd</sup> )

Are you ready for next summer? Winter Solstice is associated with the middle of winter for humans, however for your bees it's the beginning of spring. Almost immediately as the days begin to get longer the Queen will increase the number of eggs she lays. She knows that in 3 weeks when they break free from the comb the days here in Queensland will be a little longer. Only about 10 minutes longer but if she wants to get the colony to full strength by early summer she needs to start now.

The goal for the bees is to have a full colony ready to reproduce on a colony level (i.e. swarm) at the beginning of summer when food is abundant (best chance of survival). That means preparations such as brood rearing begin at the first signs of longer days and the promise of warmer weather resulting in hives (hopefully) overflowing with bees by October.

As a beekeeper wishing to discourage that workforce from leaving, you need to walk a bit of a tightrope. Encourage brood rearing while protecting the colony from starvation as the bees feed ever increasing numbers of larvae. At the same time discouraging swarm preparations in the same time period.

Things to think about:

If the weather is too cold to open your hives it can be useful just to spend a little time watching your bees come and go during the warmest part of the day. What's the bee population like, are the hives all the same or do you have any weaker hives? Look for signs of robbing if a hive is failing.

On a warm sunny day with a light wind and enough day left to let your bees warm up again before sundown, open your hives

1 Check the health of your hives, in particular check for AFB.

2 Check to see if you have a Queen by finding her or evidence she is laying.

3 Check to see if there is honey (food) for your bees. Consider if, and when, you need to feed them or rob them.

5 Begin to make space for your bees to allow the colony to grow.

Details of all these tips and how to manage your hives can be found in "The Bee Book" by Peter Warhurst and Roger Goebel. There are copies in our club library available for members to borrow if you don't have one.

## Suspect varroa mites detected at Townsville Port

Suspect varroa mites have been detected on an Asian honey bee nest that was recently found and destroyed at the Port of Townsville. The nest was located on 16 May 2019 as a result of bee lining activities where foraging bees are tracked. The suspect mites were sent to the CSIRO's laboratory in Canberra for identification to species level, with initial results indicating *Varroa jacobsoni*. A national eradication program has been in place since the detection of varroa mite on Asian honey bees at the Port of Townsville in June 2016. No Asian honey bees associated with the 2016 detection have been found since November 2016.

Genetic testing of bee material from the May 2019 detection at the Port indicates this is a new incident, with these Asian honey bees likely to have arrived recently from Papua New Guinea (PNG) or the Solomon Islands.

The Asian honey bee is approximately 10mm long with yellow and black stripes on the abdomen. Heightened surveillance continues around Townsville Port and within a 15-kilometre radius. Port and transport workers are encouraged to be on the look-out and report suspect bees that may have come in on cargo via the *See. Secure. Report* hotline on **1800 798 636**.

The general public can report Asian honey bee detections to the national Exotic Plant Pest Hotline on **1800 084 881**.

Townsville bee keepers are asked to be especially vigilant in reporting any suspect Asian honey bee sightings and/or varroa mite detections.
