Field Day Report

Well, after months of planning and organisation the Field Day arrived. The weather for the event was fantastic with it even being a little cooler than of late. We had a fabulous turn out of stall holders and again many thanks for continuing to support the club. By 9.00am the honey competition was underway albeit that entries were down a little on last year due mainly to the poor honey production this year. After the official opening by Trevor Weatherhead, our vice president George Pallot introduced our first speaker of the day, Dr Rebecca Laws who gave an excellent presentation on Biosecurity and hive hygiene practices as well as information pertinent to AFB, EFB and other pests including some exotic ones. After the presentation it was off to the bee cage for a practical demonstration of the sugar shake and alcohol wash. Following the traditional scones and jam for morning tea, our next presenter was **Dr Simon D Williams**, School of Science and Engineering Faculty of Science, Health, Education and Engineering, University of the Sunshine Coast speaking on "Manuka Honey and the Trees It Comes From". Dr Williams gave us an insightful presentation on the developing research into Manuka and its sources. If we get it right, Australia could be the leading supplier of medical honey in the future. **Dr Tran** was our next presenter speaking on "Exploring the value of the Australian honey bee propolis". Most of the beekeepers seemed a lot more attentive when we heard "\$400 a kilo". Dr Tran is still looking for samples, and the club can provide his contact details if you would like to contribute to his research. Once again, many thanks to all our Speakers. After lunch the event concluded with the cent auction, lucky door prize and the InterClub Trophy Results. It was great to see some of our sister clubs from around the state at the field day winning a few trophies on the day. The I&WMBA did however retain the trophy this year, but we handed the iconic yellow smoker back to the Gold Coast representative signifying that next year they are the hosts.

Hive Aid launched for drought-affected beekeepers

Hive + Wellness — in collaboration with Rural Aid and The Australian Honey Bee Industry Council (AHBIC) — has launched Hive Aid, a drought and bushfire relief campaign aimed specifically at struggling beekeepers.

The 2019/2020 honey season is forecast to be the lowest on record, with drought and bushfire decimating available water and flowering trees, and severe heat further impacting survival and activity of bee populations.

Hive + Wellness — which sources honey from over half the country's professional beekeepers for use in its Capilano brand — is calling on consumers and government to back Australian beekeepers and honey bees, warning that Australia's \$58 billion agricultural industry is at risk.

Hive + Wellness COO Ben McKee said, "Bees and beekeepers have a crucial role to play in our food production, and right now they are in a battle for survival. Hive Aid will provide much-needed assistance during some of the worst conditions in memory.

"We are already seeing falling bee populations and the increasing risk of an exodus from the industry by beekeepers who can no longer maintain viable operations. If we don't take immediate action, we risk not just a fall in honey production, but declines in food production across the board," McKee said.

"Hive Aid will be overseen by AHBIC, and will provide financial and practical support to professional beekeepers. The campaign sits alongside other programs run by Rural Aid. 100% of funds raised through the Hive Aid campaign will go directly to beekeepers.
